Learning Outcomes

By the end of the “Consumer and Market Law in the European Circular Economy” summer school, participants will be able to:

1) Understand the EU policy framework

- Explain the main objectives and instruments of the European Green Deal and the Circular Economy Action Plan and their relevance for consumer and market law.
- Summarize key principles of consumer protection and market regulation in the EU context.

2) Conduct critical legal analysis

- Analyze recent court decisions on consumer rights and market regulation, assessing their implications for circular business models.
- Compare different approaches to dispute resolution and redress in the EU.

3) Apply private international law

- Determine jurisdiction and applicable law in cross-border consumer contracts within the circular economy.
- Address conflicts of law between Member States in consumer and market disputes.

4) Develop problem-solving and argumentative reasoning

- Devise legal strategies to protect consumers in sharing-economy platforms and refurbished-product markets, integrating sustainability considerations.
- Construct persuasive legal arguments in a moot court setting, identifying strengths and weaknesses of EU policy measures.

5) Enhance soft skills


- Collaborate effectively in multicultural teams to draft legal opinions and policy proposals, sharing best practices across countries.
- Manage time and resources in workshops and simulations, strengthening leadership, negotiation, and teamwork abilities.

Workload

Syllabus

- A) Consumer protection and empowerment issues
- Rights and information requirements in consumer contracts.
 - Prohibition of unfair terms and practices.
 - Liability and warranties for refurbished and second-hand goods.
- B) Private international law issues
- Jurisdiction rules for cross-border consumer disputes.
 - Determination of applicable law in international contracts.
 - Resolving conflicts of law in the circular economy context.
- C) Dispute resolution and redress issues
- Online dispute resolution mechanisms.
 - Alternative dispute resolution procedures.
- D) Market regulation
- Rules for digital gatekeepers and platform accountability.
 - Regulatory measures affecting second-hand and sharing-economy markets.
